The Rising, our signature program, is offered at Denny International and Meany middle schools. Held during the school day, students move through the program as a cohort from grades 6 to 8, supported by group mentors who prepare them to succeed in school and in life. Initially boys only, we added The Rising for Girls in 2020 based on overwhelming demand.

Mentor Recruitment is the backbone of our organization. We recruit at major community events, through word-of-mouth, and on our website. Each mentor is carefully screened, trained and agrees to serve four hours each month. Our mentors are supported by monthly Community Wellness Circles where they learn to manage stress, share concerns and live more balanced lives.

SHARING HOPES AND DREAMS

Community Wellness Circles provide a safe space primarily for mothers and female guardians. The virtual sessions focus on imparting the building blocks needed for a healthy quality life: parenting skills, conflict resolution and empowerment. Led by a trained facilitator, the Wellness Circles are a place to share hopes and dreams, offer non-judgmental support, and work through solutions. An average of 20-25 women attend the Wellness Circles each week.



Voices for Change, which began in January 2022, complements the Community Wellness Circles. The series invites top speakers to tackle such important topics as mental health and wellness, parenting in the real world, financial planning, history of the Seattle Black Panthers, and voter rights. National experts, nonprofit CEOs, and members from academia lead the virtual discussions, which draw up to 55 people.

OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENTS, LASTING CHANGE

Successful Covid-19 responses

- Quickly transitioned programs online, overcoming financial and programmatic challenges (2020).
- Launched tutoring sessions in core subject areas to keep young scholars engaged in learning during the pandemic (2020).
- Selected as a featured grantee for Elevate Washington, a joint project of School's Out Washington and Washington State Department of Commerce (2021).

Local and national recognition

- Received multi-year grants from King County's Best Starts for Kids (2019-2022) and City of Seattle (2017-2019).
- Arranged for Rising scholars to brief Seattle and King County council members on issues critical to their future (2021).
- Seattle was one of 3 CARES affiliates (out of 58) spotlighted in a national video by National CARES Mentoring Movement (2022).

MARKED IMPROVEMENTS FOR RISING SCHOLARS

In one year, interest in attending college increased from 31% to 55%



Racial pride and identity improved from **77% to 97%** Confidence and self-reliance grew from 68% to 87%
